PHILADELPHIA UNION

Philadelphia Union had their winless streak extended to seven games but still came away with a remarkable point, coming back from a three-goal deficit in the second half before concluding with a 4-4 draw with the New England Revolution on Wednesday night at PPL Park. Union have 35 points from 26 matches on the year, in fourth place in the Eastern Conference.

LAST MATCH

- The Revolution opened the lead after just nine minutes when rookie A.J. Soares headed home a free kick from near the right corner flag from Chris Tierney. Then 12 minutes later, the lead was 2-0 when Stefani Miglioranzi was whistled for a foul on New England's Rajko Lekic just inside the penalty area, and then deposited the ensuing penalty kick.
- The Revs made it 3-0 in the 26th minute when Tierney put in another cross, this time from the left touchline, and found the head of an unmarked Moncef Zerka to nod home with ease. But Union a goal back just two minutes later when Roger Torres made a quick cutback at the edge of the area and blasted a shot past Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis.
- But in the 33rd minute, New England again made the lead three as Benny Feilhaber took a pass from Lekic just outside the box and drove a long-range shot past a diving Zac MacMath into his bottom right-hand corner of the net.

- Union began their fightback in the 54th minute, when Danny Mwanga sprung Adu into the box with a well-weighted pass at the end of a long move, and the midfielder calmly took touch before netting from a tight angle on the left. Union then made it 4-3 when Le Toux was taken down in the box while going for a header, and he buried his own penalty kick.
- The comeback was completed two minutes into stoppage time. Carlos Valdes pushed the ball back into the mixer in the area, Veljko Paunovic deflected it back, and Le Toux thumped a volley inside the right-hand post for the tying goal.
- Union manager Peter Nowak made six changes to the team that lost 2-1 to Real Salt Lake at Rio Tinto Stadium.
 Zac MacMath started in goal for the injured Faryd Mondragon, Gabriel Farfan came in for brother Michael at fullback, and Carlos Valdes came back from suspension while Freddy Adu, Brian Carroll and Roger Torres came into midfield in place of Amobi Okugo, Justin Mapp, Kyle Nakazawa and Danny Mwanga.

TEAM NEWS

- It was the fifth time in MLS history a club overcame a deficit of three goals to gain a point, matching the largest in MLS history and the second this season (also: Vancouver 4, Kansas City 4, April 2). All five matches ended in draws, though the first a May 4, 1996 meeting between the MetroStars and Tampa Bay, concluded with a shootout win for the Mutiny.
- "I am not upset about the chances our team had. I was upset about how easy we gave up the goals rather than not scoring. We created some good chances and that's all it was. We gave up some chances and they scored. It is not only the good looks but it is not closing out or focus," said Union manager Peter Nowak. "But there is nothing we could do. We should have beaten them in the first place. It is mixed emotions from being three down to scoring all those goals and tying the game and still giving ourselves a chance to win the game."
- Sebastien Le Toux has scored five goals in the last four games. He has three in the last two games all from run of play, after his first three goals this season came from the penalty spot. "We need him to score goals," Danny Califf said. "We need that steady presence, the guy we can count on to score goals. It's nice he's able to be that and hopefully he can continue that scoring streak."
- "I think it's good for me," Le Toux said. "My teammates joke around with me, especially Stefani Miglioranzi, that in the last 10 games I'm going to score every game and help the team the best I can like I didn't do at the beginning of the season. I hope this is the case."
- For the first time since coming to Philadelphia Union, Freddy Adu played the full 90 minutes, making his second start in four MLS appearances since his return.
- "I was pleased with his movement all game. He had a big goal to get us back in the game," said Nowak. "It was a good day for Freddy. As you saw at the end of game he was cramping but as I told you guys he is still not physically there yet. But we will watch him each day and monitor him and get him stronger and make sure he will recover fully before we throw him back out there."
- Adu's goal was his first in MLS since May 20, 2007, when he scored for Real Salt Lake at FC Dallas.
- Making his first MLS start, Zac MacMath allowed four goals in the first half. He kept a clean sheet in his full
 professional debut, coming on at halftime in the 2-1 loss at Real Salt Lake.
- "It was tough. He let four pieces behind him in the first half but not all were completely on him. But, he came out strong in the second half and played well," Nowak said.
- While Carlos Valdes came back from suspension and played 90 minutes, Michael Farfan who started vs. RSL came in for Gabriel at halftime, after the two had again changed roles.
- "I was very happy with all of our fullbacks. We shuffled the defensive line in the second half to push some
 players forward," Nowak said. "Califf has been a rock back there and has been playing strong for weeks.
 Valdes is very stable and great back there. Our defenders are playing great and they just had a couple
 mistakes tonight."

PORTLAND TIMBERS

The Portland Timbers won for a second consecutive match at their home ground, defeating Chivas USA 1-0 on Wednesday evening at Jeld-Wen Field. The Timbers have 32 points from 26 games, now in sixth place in the Western Conference.

- The game's lone goal came a minute before the halftime break. Eric Brunner rose above Chivas defender
 Heath Pearce to meet a Mike Chabala corner kick perfectly at the near post, driving his header past Chivas
 USA goalkeeper Dan Kennedy inside the back stick.
- Timbers coach John Spencer made one change to the team that defeated Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2-1 at Jeld-Wen Field. Eric Brunner returned to central defense, in place of Mamadou Danso.

- The Timbers return to action after having their game at D.C. United, scheduled for Aug. 27, postponed because of Hurricane Irene. The game has been rescheduled for Wed., Oct. 19 at RFK Stadium.
- The Timbers have won back-to-back games for the third time in league play since coming to MLS. They have yet to win three in a row.
- "We're just learning what is required to be successful in this league," said Timbers head coach John Spencer. "I think we've grown up quickly this year. I think we grew up after we had that slump and I think we came out at the (other) end of the tunnel and I think we've grown up a little bit."
- The Timbers now face back-to-back road games, and have four of their next six games away from Jeld-Wen Field.
- "I think that we're formidable at home at times. We need to, now, after the last two performances, get on the road to D.C. and try and put in a good performance there so that we stay in this position," said Spencer. "We've got as good a chance as anybody for the eighth, ninth, and 10th positions. I don't think we're hanging on for the 10th spot. We've got a couple of good games coming up here at home and if we perform the way we did in the first half tonight we'll give teams a good run for their money."
- Officially, the Timbers have scored 12 goals from set pieces three from corner kicks, one directly from a free
 kick, and eight from free kick services. Another three goals have come from penalty kicks. In addition, two own
 goals scored by Portland opponents have started with deadball situations.
- "I watched their game and they gave up two goals on crosses against Colorado. I just felt that we had a slight advantage height-wise in the box and decided to have two in-swinging corners into the six to see how they dealt with it." Spencer said.
- Eric Brunner scored his third league goal this season, and fourth in all competitions, and all have come on setpiece opportunities. In games when Brunner has scored, the Timbers have won all four and not allowed a goal.
- The Timbers have scored 26 goals at Jeld-Wen Field, tied with Houston for the most goals scored at home this season. But on the road, they've scored just seven times tied with Real Salt Lake for fewest in MLS.
- "The road is tough. I think you can see it with all the teams, their home records are better. It could be the travel, it could be a lot of things, but we've just got to focus on putting that all behind us and get a good result," said midfielder Sal Zizzo.
- Since coming into the starting lineup onJuly 30, David Horst has seen the Timbers concede just seven goals while posting a 3-2-2 record.
- "I just think I bring something different than some of the other guys bring," Horst said. "I'm a little bit bigger than the other center backs. I bring a toughness to the defense back there. And when we play against bigger forwards like a [Eric] Hassli or [Juan Pablo] Ángel or those guys from Colorado, I think that's what I bring to the table."
- Rodney Wallace scored his international goal, the margin of victory as Costa Rica defeated the USA 1-0 on Sept. 2 at The Home Depot Center. He then played 55 minutes in a 4-0 loss to Ecuador on Tuesday.
- James Marcelin netted a goal for Haiti in a 6-0 World Cup qualifying rout of the U.S. Virgin Islands on Sept. 2, then scored again in the 4-2 win over Curação on Tuesday, also a CONCACAF qualifier.

BACK ON TRACK

After a hard fought comeback Wednesday night, Philadelphia will look to build on their second half performance against New England when Portland Timbers travel to PPL Park Saturday. Wednesday's draw moved Philadelphia into third place in the Eastern Conference. Their 35 points matches that of Houston Dynamo, but with a goal differential of +5, they win the tiebreaker.

Philadelphia are still without a League win since July 17, when they were able to beat New England Revolution in Foxboro. A win on Saturday would go a long way towards securing the franchises' first playoff berth.

LAST MATCH VS. PORTLAND TIMBERS

The only time Philadelphia Union and Portland Timbers have met was this past May at JELD-WEN Field. Although Portland was able to scrap out a 1-0 victory over Philadelphia, the team will face a tougher test at PPL Park Saturday night.

Philadelphia entered the game without veteran leader Danny Califf (illness) making way for the twin brothers, Gabriel and Michael Farfan, to make their first MLS starts. The brothers played on the outside of a makeshift defense anchored by Sheanon Williams and Carlos Valdes.

The best chance for Philadelphia came in the 39th-minute when Danny Mwanga did well to get past his defender and make an angled run down the right flank. The second year forward tried to pick out Carlos Ruiz with a cross, but the opportunity was thwarted by a last second poke from Portland defender Rodney Wallace. The ball fell to Sebastien Le Toux who was forced into an off-balanced shot that was easily handled by keeper Troy Perkins.

The only goal of the match came midway through the second half. Amobi Okugo was whistled for a handball just inside the Union half and Portland captain Jack Jewsbury lined up the free kick. He played a ball into the sixyard box where Mamadou Danso rose to head the ball past Mondragon, just inside the near post.

In one of Philadelphia's best comebacks in franchise history, Union rallied to score three goals in the second half and to earn what could be a crucial point in the race for a 2011 playoff berth.

The first half saw New England Revolution jump out to a 4–1 lead. A.J. Soares, Rajko Lekic, Moncef Zerka and Benny Feilhaber all netted for New England while Roger Torres gave Philadelphia their only shred of hope with a beautiful strike past Revolution keeper, Matt Reis.

Peter Nowak made changes in personnel and formation to begin the second half, both reflecting a more attacking approach. Danny Mwanga and Michael Farfan replaced Gabriel Farfan and Stefani Miglioranzi, respectively, and Philadelphia came out in a 3-4-3. New England came out defensively, content to sit back and throw men behind the ball.

The comeback began in the 54th-minute when Danny Mwanga picked out Freddy Adu streaking into the box. The forward calmly netted his first goal in a Union jersey. The Union attack continued and in the 80th-minute, Sebastien Le Toux was awarded a penalty. Philly's star Frenchman found the corner to make it 4-3.



Timbers' defender, Eric Brunner, also played for University of Maryland but attended the University a few years earlier in 2004.


THE DIFFERENCE IS KEY

Philadelphia Union's reserve squad beat New England 2-0 Thursday morning to snap a six-match winless run. Jack McInerney and Danny Mwanga both scored before halftime, but Thorne Holder's performance is what stood out on the day. The Union goalkeeper made several big stops to preserve the shutout.

Trialist Joe Tait assisted McInerney's goal when he headed a Nakazawa corner back across the box for the striker to hammer home. The Englishman has had a big presence on set pieces so far, scoring on a corner kick against Harrisburg City Islanders and assisting in the match on Thursday.

CLOSE AT THE TOP

As the regular season winds down, the fight for the playoffs in the Eastern Conference is heating up. Only eight points separate #1 Columbus Crew (40) from #5 New York Red Bulls (32). Philadelphia Union (35) sit at #3, ahead of Houston Dynamo (35) by means of goal differential. (Union: +5, Dynamo: +1) D.C. United falls in at #6 with 31 points but have at least two games in hand on the five teams above them.

If the postseason were to start today, Philadelphia would finish in third of the top three eastern conference finishers. They would play the Eastern Conference's second place team, Sporting Kansas City, in a two-legged, aggregate series.



HEAD COACH JOHN SPENCER

After a standout 18-year professional playing career, Glasgow, Scotland, native John Spencer served as an assistant coach for the Houston Dynamo under head coach Dominic Kinnear for nearly five seasons (2006-2010). He helped lead the Dynamo to back-to-back MLS Cup championships in 2006 and 2007 and four consecutive playoff appearances. From 2006-08, Spencer also coached the Dynamo Reserves, guiding the Dynamo Reserves to the 2008 MLS Reserve Division championship. On Aug. 10, 2010, Spencer was named the first head coach in MLS Timbers history, and on April 14 of this season, Spencer earned his first win as an MLS head coach as the Timbers poured in four goals in a 4-2 win over the Chicago Fire.



As a player, Spencer played for such noted English clubs as Chelsea, Everton and Queens Park Rangers, and Scotland's Glasgow Rangers. In MLS, Spencer starred for the Colorado Rapids from 2001-04, becoming the only player to be the team's MVP and scoring leader in the same season more than once.

Spencer, 40, began his professional playing career in 1987 with Rangers. As a striker, he played for several top-flight clubs over 14 seasons in Scotland and England, most notably amassing 43 goals with English-power Chelsea (1992-96).

Spencer joined MLS and the Rapids in 2001 and was considered the team's undeniable leader due to his skill and work ethic. During his time with Colorado, he played in 88 games and his 37 goals ranks among franchise career leaders. Spencer set the club's single-season mark for goals (14) and career mark for assists (17), was a two-time MLS Best XI selection (2001, 2003) and was a finalist for the league's MVP award in 2003.

The two-time MLS All-Star (2001, 2003) captained the Rapids to three straight playoff appearances from 2002-04. Spencer etched his name into Rapids history on Aug. 30, 2009, when he was inducted to the Rapids Gallery of Honor.

During his playing career, Spencer earned 14 caps with the Scotland National Team from 1994-97. He earned his first cap for Scotland against Russia on November 16, 1994, in Glasgow. His favorite soccer memories include playing for Scotland against England at Wembley Stadium in the 1996 European Championship. He last appeared for Scotland on May 27, 1997, in a friendly against Wales.

TIMBERS MATCH AT D.C. UNITED RESCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 19 DUE TO HURRICANE IRENE

The Timbers' match against D.C. United, originally scheduled for Aug. 27, has been rescheduled to 5 p.m. (PT) on Wednesday, Oct. 19 at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C. due to the weather impact of Hurricane Irene along the East Coast. The rescheduled match will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with live radio broadcasts on 750 AM The Game and in Spanish on La Pantera 940 AM. The change means the Timbers will play three games in nine days to close out the 2011 MLS Regular Season schedule including ending the year with consecutive road games at D.C. (Oct. 19) and Real Salt Lake on Oct. 22.

FOUR TIMBERS JOIN RESPECTIVE NATIONAL TEAMS FOR FRIENDLIES, WORLD CUP QUALIFIERS

Timbers players Rodney Wallace (Costa Rica), James Marcelin (Haiti), Lovel Palmer (Jamaica) and Steve Purdy (El Salvador) all joined up with their national teams for the Sept. 2 and Sept. 6 FIFA international dates. Wallace, who earned his first cap Sept. 2 against the United States, scored the game-winning goal against the Americans in a 1-0 win at the Home Depot Center in Carson, Calif. Marcelin scored the opening goal of Haiti's 6-0 rout of the U.S. Virgin Islands on Sept. 2 in a 2014 World Cup qualifier in Haiti - the first home game played in Haiti since the devastating earthquake of January 2010 - and added another goal against Curaçao on Sept. 6. Purdy was an unused substitute for El Salvador in a 3-2 win over the Dominican Republic on Sept. 2 in a World Cup qualifier and didn't travel with the team to the Cayman Islands for next match. Palmer did not travel to Ecuador for Jamaica's 5-2 loss on Sept. 2 and was an unused substitute for its Sept. 6 friendly against Colombia, a 2-0 loss in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

TIMBERS TOP CHIVAS USA 1-0 ON BRUNNER GAME-WINNER

Defender Eric Brunner scored his second game-winning goal of the season and Troy Perkins logged his sixth shutout as the Portland Timbers defeated Chivas USA 1-0 before a sellout crowd of 18,627 at JELD-WEN Field on Aug. 24. With the win, the Timbers move into the thick of the wildcard race for the MLS playoffs, moving past Chivas USA and D.C. United in the wildcard standings to pull even with the New York Red Bulls at 32 points in the 10th and final playoff spot, with New York holding the advantage on tiebreakers (goal differential). Brunner tallied the game's lone goal just before halftime, heading in a corner kick from defender Mike Chabala. The Timbers forced Chivas USA goalkeeper Dan Kennedy into six saves, putting seven of their 17 shots on the night on frame. Anchored by Perkins' two saves, the Portland defense held Chivas USA scoreless, limiting the visiting side to just two shots on goal. After a series of close chances throughout the first half, the Timbers claimed a 1-0 lead in the 44th minute. A corner kick by Chabala on the right side dropped in at the center of the penalty area. Running through uncontested, Brunner drove his header inside the far post, beating Kennedy for the eventual game-winning strike.

LAST TIME OUT AGAINST THE UNION

Defender Futty Danso elevated to reach Jack Jewsbury's corner kick and headed home the game-winning goal in the 72nd minute as the Timbers earned a 1-0 victory in the first meeting between the two teams on May 6 at JELD-WEN Field. The win was Portland's fourth in a row at home to start the season. Troy Perkins came up with two saves and earned the clean sheet in goal, his second of the year, while the Timbers defense helped contain a strong Union offense that included former Oregon State University star Danny Mwanga.

REST AND RELAXATION

Thanks to the effects of Hurricane Irene, the Timbers have had an extended break without a match. Since its last match on Aug. 24, Portland has gone a season-long 16 days without playing an MLS regular season match. The streak ranks tied for second among MLS teams for time off this season. Chicago (Jul. 17-Aug. 2) went 17 days between games this season and Real Salt Lake went 16 days (April 14-29).

PUSH FOR THE PLAYOFFS

The Timbers (9-12-5, 32pts) head into Saturday's match with the Union tied for the 10th and final MLS Cup playoff position with the New York Red Bulls (6-6-14, 32pts), whom they visit Sept. 24.

A PLACE TO CALL HOME

After spending the first three weeks of their inaugural MLS campaign on the road, the final stages of renovation work at JELD-WEN Field were completed in time for the Timbers to debut their impressively refurbished home on a national stage. The Timbers, in front of sold-out crowds of 18,627, scored seven goals on their way to opening up the stadium with a pair of wins over the Chicago Fire and FC Dallas in mid-April. JELD-WEN Field underwent a \$40 million renovation that transformed the already iconic downtown Portland venue into one of the most unique and intimate soccer venues in North America. JELD-WEN Field improvements include the addition

of an entirely new eastside seating section that will house the new KeyBank Club and premium club seats, the Widmer Brothers Southern Front deck behind the south goal that will provide unique vantage points ideal for casual group seating, a new, state-of-the-art video board that features the latest in high-definition technology for an enhanced fan experience and a new FieldTurf playing surface



well-suited for the variety of sporting and community events that will be featured each year at JELD-WEN Field. Phase I of construction, which included foundation work for the new eastside seats, began in early 2010, while renovation on a larger scale began on Sept. 7, 2010, as demolition commenced following the Division-2 Timbers' home schedule. JELD-WEN Field, located in the heart of the city, was originally constructed in 1926 and has undergone a number of transformations over the years, none more substantial than the current renovation. The stadium has housed some of the most memorable events in its 85-year life, including presidential visits, an Elvis Presley performance in 1957, Pele's last official game as a professional and the 2003 Women's World Cup. It was home to the NASL Timbers from 1975-82 and most recently served as the home grounds for the USL Timbers from 2001-10.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Midfielder Jack Jewsbury picked up his team-leading eighth assist on Diego Chara's goal in a 2-1 win over Vancouver on Aug. 20, setting a career high and moving into a tie for fourth in MLS in assists. Jewsbury, who bested the old mark he set in 2008 with Kansas City, also ranks fifth in the league with 22 points. Jewsbury has tallied at least three points in each of the last five months. His streak of at least one point in four consecutive games (2 goals, 2 assists total) came to an end on Aug. 24 against Chivas USA. The streak made him the only player in MLS this season with multiple points streaks of at least four games. Jewsbury also had a career-high-tying five-game points streak from April 30-May 29, which is tied for the second-longest in the league in 2011.

HEAD HUNTING

In all four games (all competitions) in which defender Eric Brunner has scored, the Timbers have won and kept clean sheets in each game. The defender has found the back of the net four times this season and scored two game-winning goals on headers, both coming in 1-0 victories against Columbus on May 29, and against Chivas USA on Aug. 24.

PERKINS CLOSING IN ON CAREER MARK

Timbers goalkeeper Troy Perkins needs just two more clean sheets to tie his career high of eight shutouts, set in both the 2006 and 2007 seasons with D.C. United. In 2006, Perkins started all 30 games for United, earning an overall record of 15-6-9 with 8 shutouts. The following season, Perkins matched the mark in 29 matches. In those two seasons Perkins missed just one game, playing 5,310 minutes of a possible 5,400 minutes in goal. Perkins has anchored a Timbers defense that has recorded six shutout in MLS play.

KEEP A CLEAN SHEET, GET A WIN

This season, the Portland Timbers are the only team in MLS to have accomplished the feat of winning every match in which they have shutout their opponent. With six wins in six shutouts in the 2011 MLS season to date, the Timbers are the last remaining team in the league to go without recording a 0-0 draw. Two teams accomplished this feat in 2010: the expansion Philadelphia Union recorded two shutouts and won both and the 2010 MLS Cup Champion Colorado Rapids went 8-for-8 on clean sheets during the regular season. Since MLS started using ties in 2000, FC Dallas (5-of-5 in 2009, 6-of-6 in 2006, 3-of-3 in 2002) and the LA Galaxy (2-of-2 in 2008, 4-of-4 in 2003, 7-of-7 in 2002) have recorded the most instances of a perfect clean-sheet record with three each.

FIRST ONE'S THE CHARM

The Timbers are 9-1-2 when scoring first and 0-11-3 when allowing the first goal of a match. In a 2-1 win over Whitecaps FC on Aug. 20, Portland conceded a goal and won for the first time since recording its first two victories in high-scoring affairs back in April.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

After defeating Chivas USA 1-0 at JELD-WEN Field on Aug. 24, the Timbers have clinched a winning record at home for their inaugural season with a record that currently stands at 8-4-2. The Timbers become the fifth MLS team to have a winning home record as an expansion team. The Chicago Fire posted the best home record for an expansion club when they went 13-3 in home matches in 1998.

SCOUTING THE UNION

The Union got off to a great start in their second year of existence, holding the Eastern Conference's top spot for a large part of this season. Philadelphia has earned unbeaten streaks of four and five games, but are currently mired in a franchise-long, seven-game winless streak (four draws, three losses). As it stands, the Union sit in third place in the Eastern Conference and eighth overall in the MLS Playoff standings. Down the stretch, Philadelphia faces seven teams strongly in the playoff picture over its final eight games. Head coach Peter Nowak's side, which features French forward Sebastien Le Toux, overcame a 4-1 deficit on Wednesday against New England to salvage a 4-4 draw. Le Toux, who ranks seventh in MLS with 20 points, scored twice in the final 10 minutes to boost the Union. Recently-acquired United States international midfielder Freddy Adu scored his first goal in MLS since May 20, 2007 on Wednesday against the Revolution. Despite their recent troubles, Philadelphia is still 5-1-7 at PPL Park this season and have only been held scoreless once at home.

NAGBE SCORES A LATE BRACE AS TIMBERS RESERVES DRAW 3-3 WITH GALAXY

The Timbers Reserves ran their unbeaten streak to five games as midfielder/forward Darlington Nagbe scored in the 78th and 92nd minute to help the Timbers Reserves overcome a two-goal deficit and earn a 3-3 draw against the LA Galaxy Reserves on Sept. 1 in front of 4,882 fans at JELD-WEN Field. Bright Dike scored in the 50th minute to level the score at 1-1 for Portland, but two LA goals within six minutes of each other pushed the Galaxy Reserves ahead 3-1 in the 72nd minute. Nagbe headed in a cross from Rodrigo Lopez in the 78th minute to close the gap. In stoppage time, Dike had a strong shot from the right side saved by goalkeeper Brian Perk, but the rebound fell right to Nagbe for the equalizer. The Timbers Reserves look to continue their unbeaten run on Sept. 27 against Chivas USA at JELD-WEN Field.

MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER AND NBC SPORTS ANNOUNCE PARTNERSHIP

Major League Soccer and the NBC Sports Group announced last week a three-year media rights agreement, which commences at the start of the 2012 MLS season. The partnership calls for 45 MLS games and four U.S. Men's National Team contests to be televised live across both NBC and NBC Sports Network each season. This marks the first rights deal for the newly-named cable channel that will be re-branded from VER-SUS on January 2, 2012. The announcement was made today by MLS Commissioner and Soccer United Marketing CEO Don Garber and Mark Lazarus, Chairman, NBC Sports Group. Each season, NBC will broadcast two regular-season MLS games, two playoff games and two appearances by the U.S. Men's National Team, marking the first time four MLS matches will be broadcast on English-language network television since 2002. The NBC Sports Network will televise 38 regular-season games, three playoff games and two U.S. Men's National Team matches. All telecasts on NBC and NBC Sports Network will consist of pre-game and post-game coverage. According to the agreement, the NBC Sports Group obtains digital rights across all platforms and devices for the games it televises.
